Year 2



Florence made to the life of wounded soldiers and worked hard to include adverbs.






They had a fabulous time dancing with Pudsey and cheered the rickshaw on. as it boarded the ferry.

Miss Last and I were extremely proud of all of the children and are hope vou saw us television.


