

This week in Foundation 1



We have been learning the story 'The Little Red Hen'. In our areas of provision we have been playing with a farm in the small world, buying eggs and veg in the farm shop, and serving people in the farm cafe.

We have been helping the Little Red Hen by making some bread for her in our investigation tray and making play dough cakes for her. We searched our classroom for the colour red and found some materials to make our own 'Little Red Hen'.

We have been learning about farm animals from a variety of non fiction books, the children went outdoors and



made their own (muddy!) pond for the ducks and have been playing with a variety of farm animals.

In maths we have been learning all about the number 2, the children

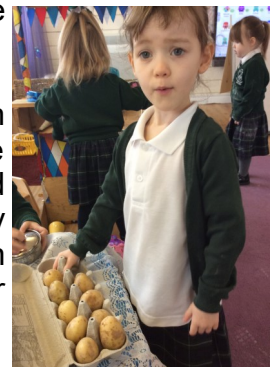


searched indoors and outdoors for things that could come to our number 2 party! The children also searched outside for red hens that Mrs Collinson had hidden, they carefully counted how many they could find.

We have also played some games each day for maths week, including throwing bean bags in a bucket and counting how many we managed to get in. We compared buckets saying who had more or less.

In phonics we have been making and listening to animal noises that we might hear on a farm and matching the animal to the noise.

This week we have been learning the nursery rhyme 'Mary had a Little Lamb' and we acted out the nursery rhyme and have been learning where the wool for our jumper comes from.

The children have had a fantastic start to the year and have settled in to Year 5 well. They have adapted to the changes without complaint and do their best to follow the new rules.

During the Autumn term we concentrate on number within our Maths lessons. The children have continued to develop their place value, multiplication, division, addition and subtraction skills. In addition the children have also learnt new mathematical concepts such as factors, prime number, square numbers and cubed numbers.

In Science, the children Space. They now know why we have night and day, why we have seasons and which planets make up the solar system.

In History the children have been learning about the transatlantic slave trade and are



now aware that slavery is still taking place today. They have learnt about the treatment of slaves in America and how some slaves were able to escape. In addition, in our English lessons we have learnt about the real-life story of a man named Henry 'Box' Brown who escaped slavery by mailing himself to freedom.
