Needless to say, dav was an absolute the success! The children had a fantastic day filled with practical learning and discussion.

Year 4's day started with a focus upon listening skills. We began with a few 'listening games' designed to get the children to focus upon really listening hard. The first game involved the children taking it in turns to sit in centre of the the room. blindfolded and guarding a set of keys. Their task was simple (or so they thought); to point at the person who was trying to sneak up and steal the kevs. This proved to be a great moment of realization for everyone when we stopped to listen, we realised how challenging it can be!

The next game involved the children memorising a shopping

list as it grew. No easy task. Each child had to listen carefully to the children who came before, they then recited the list before adding their own items. For added difficulty, the list had to be in alphabetical order.



After we'd finished our listening games, the children moved onto mathematics.

They were tasked with investigating division using practical resources. They worked in teams and produced a video each to explain what they had discovered







about division from their investigation. How many different ways can you divide this number? Do you always get a whole number? How is division related to multiplication? Year 4 themselves excelled and produced some fantastic reasoning.

For our English lesson, year 4 created new dialogue for the story that we've been studying (The Journey). The children then acted out their new scenes from the book. explaining how the characters might be feeling throughout their challenging journey to escape the war. The children were really mature with a difficult subject matter and produced excellent some dialogue to move the story narrative forward.

Our day finished off with a spot of debate. As part of our topic (migration), the children formed a class parliament to discuss the issue, "Should the UK limit the numbers of migrant and refugees that are allow to enter the

country." I was really impressed with both teams. They debated really well, listened carefully to the points raise and skilfully developed their own counter arguments.

Overall, "No Pen Day," proved to be a massively

valuable day that the children all really benefited from. I, for one, cannot wait for the next one!
