As part of our revision preparation, children have been taking part in a range of 'Book Talk' activities. During these sessions, children have learnt to refine their skills when analysing a text. They have been given a range of text extracts and images from mystery books, and the children have worked as detectives to find evidence and clues in the text, making

sensible and interesting predictions based on what they have found. The children have led a range of mature classroom discussions and debates; found meaning in a range of abstract statements and have even discovered lots of things which the adults hadn't noticed!

The amount of effort the children have put into these sessions has been admirable, with the

children making great improvements in the way they can analyse a text in-depth, which has served as fantastic preparation for children to tackle the reading SAT papers in a few weeks time.


We are working hard in our English lessons using our text, 'The Pebble in my Pocket'. We have used talk for writing to help us rehearse the text and

You will have received a letter yesterday detailing exciting new changes which will be taking place in our Foundation stage from September 2017. This includes 15 hour provision for 2 year old children free of charge to eligible families. Our Foundation stage environment is to be remodelled during the summer to enable us to meet the requirements to offer provision for two year olds.

30 hrs funded provision for 3-4 year olds
