We have started to practise our songs for the nativity: A Christmas Recipe, which will take place on the 19th December in the morning and 20th December in the afternoon. Our Year 1s will take part in the choir as stars and snowflakes, and Year 2 have been given a part.

We are very excited for this and can't wait for you all to see it!

With Y6 this week

We have been working really hard across all areas of the curriculum. I continue to be impressed with how well our Year 6s are progressing and are keen to know and hit their learning targets. We have settled into a new classroom and are enjoying sorting out our class library. We are having a big focus on reading this half term and children have their reading challenge and an additional home reading book to read each week. The more we read, the better we get and the more confident we will become as writers!

We have been learning about Ernest Shackleton and his heroic exploits trying to


