Roles and Responsibilities:

Governors will ensure that:

- This policy is reviewed on a regular basis.

- They monitor the effectiveness of this policy.

The Headteacher will ensure that:

- This policy is implemented.
- This policy is shared with all new parents to the school.
- Consider reasonable requests from parents for exemptions to this policy.

Staff will ensure that:

 They implement this policy, including writing to parents if incorrect uniform is worn, reporting to the Headteacher and/or Key Stage Team Leader, where appropriate.

Parents/carers are expected to:

- Ensure that their child(ren) comes to school in the correct uniform.
- Request, in writing to the headteacher, for an exemption from this policy for a specified time where
 exceptional circumstances prevent their child(ren) from wearing full uniform.

Pupils are expected to (appropriate to their age/maturity):

Ensure that they support the school and parents in wearing the correct uniform to school.

School Uniform

When deciding on school uniform, every effort has been made to ensure that we achieve best value for money whilst maintaining high standards, inline with the newly revised government uniform legislation that will come into effect in September 2022.

School specific uniform may be bought from our main supplier: Wirral Uniform Centre, (Tartan kilts and pinafore). Other items such as shirts, blouses, knitted jumpers, knitted cardigans, trousers/shorts, summer dresses and school shoes are available from a range of sources.

All uniform should be labelled, either with a laundry marker pen or with an iron-on/sewn-in label

All aspects of our school uniform are expected to be adhered to and are monitored through our school Behaviour and Discipline Policy. If we find that a child is wearing clothing not specified on the uniform list without good reason, we will send a letter home reminding parents and carers of the school policy. We want all our children to take pride in their appearance.

Bottle green knitted cardigan (available from a range of supermarkets or the uniform shop)

Bottle green knitted jumper (available from a range of supermarkets or the uniform shop)





School tartan kilt OR School tartan pinafore dress



Green and white checked dresses with white socks. (Summer)

Grey trousers

Grey shorts (Summer term)

Navy tights **OR** white grey or black socks

Sensible black shoes.

The suppliers for school uniform are Wirral Uniform Centre, Birkenhead(Tel.647 9588 for kilts and pinafores.)

Footwear

Sensible black shoes must be worn. Trainers, sandals or boots are **NOT** permitted

<u>Hair</u>

Long hair must be tied back (Hair band/bobbles should be sensible and ideally green)

Large or sparkly hair accessories are NOT permitted

Extreme hair styles or colours are **NOT** permitted. (This includes shaved hair designs/patterns)

Jewellery (exception stud earrings) is NOT permitted

(pupils should be able to remove their earrings themselves for PE)

Watches are permitted

Body adornments eg. make up, painted nails and tattoos are not permitted

Post Covid-19 we have decided to continue to ask pupils to come to school wearing their PE kit on their PE day. As a result of this, we have added warmer items to the PE list. These include leggings, tracksuit trousers and a plain green unbranded hoodie. It is not compulsory to buy a hoodie as the normal knitted school cardigan or knitted jumper will also be permitted. Please note that branded expensive tracksuit trousers will not be permitted. This will be monitored.
