Power of Reading in Year One!



We have had lots of fun this week in our Literacy lessons. For our Power of Reading books: The Bog Baby and The Robot and the Bluebird we have been getting creative. For the children reading The Bog Baby, we have created our o w n

habitats for the Bog Baby to live in, just like the sisters do in the story. To do this we explored the school grounds and collected bluebells, leaves,

shells and pebbles. We made sure our homes were really comfortable so that the Bog Baby would feel happy. The children really enjoyed being creative and the outdoor learning. We are



now focusing in our lessons on writing a set of instructions for how to make a Bog Baby home, using our Pi Corbett techniques to support us.

For the children reading The Robot and the Bluebird, the children painted pictures of

Robots for display. The children had some fantastic ideas for what a Robot should look like and were very inventive. The children are now focusing on letter writing and learning about the

features of a letter.








Staying safe in the sun
