Which class can make the most Sugar Swaps in 1 week?



DID YOU KNOW?



Year 5 have been learning about Ancient Egypt. We looked at the history of pyramid building. In 5 MR pupils assembled

3d pyramids from a 2d net and created a desert floor from sand coloured paper. The children aligned their pyramids carefully on the sandy floor as we had learned in class

that pyramids were built with the four corners facing the four points of the compass. The pyramids were sited on the West side of the river Nile as the ancient Egyptians believed the west was where the sun god, Ra,



went to bed each night. Did you know that the ancient pyramids were the tallest buildings in the world right up until the Eiffel Tower in Paris was built in 1889?

In maths, 5C created square based pyramids from cubes so that we could see the stepped sides. The children investigated how many small cubes were needed to build each layer of the pyramid. They realised that each layer was a square number so there was no need to count each cube – we could just multiply!

The first week of March saw us all celebrating World Book Day when year 5 were some of the most stylishly dressed pupils in the school. We had many interesting characters in our classrooms that day. Little Red, Michael Angelo and Rafael, Harry Potter, a princess and a witch sat in class as pupils created poetic descriptions and images inspired by the

b o o k , 'Varmints' for 5MR and 'The Witches' by Roald Dahl for 5C.
