
The Power of Reading

'Moon Man' by Tomi Ungerer as part of our Power of Reading project.

FOUNDATION 2





Strategies to Encourage Speech and Language Development

At St Joseph's we value the importance of early language

development. Some children start school with delayed speech/language development. We are fortunate in having our own Speech Therapist at St Joseph's, Rebecca Taggart. She attends clinics at school fortnightly with Mrs Airey (SENCo). Parents are invited to attend and individual programmes are set with targets that can be reinforced at home and school and their reviews are set termly. Some helpful hints for useful strategies to help your child speech and language with their development are outlined below.

Handy Tips

- 1. Try and be at eye-level with your child so that you show them you are interested in what they are trying to tell you.
- 2. It may be helpful to count to 10 slowly in your head, to give your child enough time to say something to you.
- 3. Comments should be at a simple language level, eg 'Here's the ball', 'That's a big car'. 'Daddy's washing the car'. Emphasise the important words in your sentence.
- 4. Pause after you make a comment to give your child a chance to say something.
- 5. Talk about activities as you are doing them e.g. 'we're walking up the stairs'.
- 6. Make your voice sound interesting 'I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blooooow your house down'.

Expand your child's language

- 1. When giving a choice if you know what your child will choose then put this at the end of the sentence e.g. 'do you want water or milk'?
- 2. Giving a choice may also solve some conflicts, eg if your child refuses to put a hat on you could give them a choice, eg 'do you want a blue hat or a red hat?' This gives your child an element of choice whilst you still get what

you want!

Give a reason to communicate

- 1. Show your child something new or interesting or something they do not recognise. Wait for them to start communicating to you about it before you say something.
- 2. You could try putting something they want visible but out of reach so that they need to ask for it. E.g. They have a car mat but the cars are in a box out of reach. If your child points or makes a sound respond with words they would say if they could e.g. "car", "Want".

Targeted vocabulary

1. It may be helpful to target specific day to day vocabulary that your child will find motivating and useful to say.



- 2. Encourage action words e.g. "wash" as well as naming words e.g. "book".
- 3. It is sometimes useful to isolate specific words at the end of a sentence to provide a good model of the word e.g. "Open the bag" (pause briefly) "Open".

If you feel that your child has any difficulties with their speech and language development, please make an appointment through the school office or directly with Mrs Airey to discuss the possibility of a referral. We are excited to offer a speech and language workshop early in September 2017 to explain in more detail the service we offer and also the opportunity for parents to meet in person our speech therapist.
