

Year 2 have had a lovely first week back to school after a sunny half term.



In English, we have started learning about a new story called Jack and the Baked Beanstalk by Colin Stimpson.

It is about a little boy called Jack who with his mum run a little café. Unfortunately, business has dried up and they are nearly broke. We have been making predictions about what we think might happen in the story and looking at the similarities and differences between this story and another very famous story called Jack and the Beanstalk.



In Maths this week, we have continued practising how to multiply and divide by 2, 5 and 10. We have been doing this practically and then using what we know to solve trickier problems.

This week in art year 2 have been exploring the



formal elements of pattern, texture and tone. Firstly, we looked at the patterns around us and then dipped everyday objects in paint to create repeating patterns. We varied the direction of the

pattern and colours of the paint and paper.

Then we went in search of different textured materials that interested us. We took rubbings of these using the side of



our crayon.

We then learnt about 'frottage', tearing our rubbings to make pictures in the style of the artist who created the technique, Max Ernst.



In our curriculum of hope lessons, we have been looking at the similarities and differences between the UK and Australia. We have been amazed with how big Australia is and how far away it is (23 hours on an airplane).





Healthy Eating with Year 3

Year 3 have been learning all about healthy eating in science and we have looked at the different food groups and why it is important to eat a balanced diet. We tracked our food intake for a week and collated data on the amount of fruit and vegetables we eat and put our information into graphs so we could clearly see how we could improve our diets and what we were doing well at.





We then created persuasive articles to encourage others to think about their diet to ensure that they are getting the appropriate nutrients we need to grow and stay healthy. We then had our own healthy picnic and tried lots of tasty treats we tried fruits and vegetables that we haven't all tried before and found some new favourites!



Clean Air Day!!

We learnt about how Air pollution affects our body and is the largest environmental health risk we face today. 
