A very busy week for Year 5

Year 5 have embraced lots of exciting opportunities this week! Our learning challenge theme is Egypt. So far we have enjoyed studying a breadth of topics: from Ancient Egypt's gory mummification processes to the delights that the major cities of modern Egypt have to offer!



This week we have been putting our sales techniques to the test and

have risen to the challenge very well. Miss Lewtas split our class into teams of 5: each team had to research Egypt and what it has on offer for tourists. Once we had gathered our



information we had to analyse some adverts think and hard about the features of an effective

sales pitch. Then each team wrote their own script for a TV advert. Miss Lewtas, Ms Rayner and Mrs Easton were all blown away by our use of sophisticated vocabulary and catchy slogans! We did such a great job that some of us have been inspired to travel to Egypt one day and see its enchanting sights and colourful culture for ourselves. By the end of next week we will have recorded our TV adverts. Who knows, maybe this could be a future career path for some of us?!



This term's RE topic for Year 5 is about other all faiths. As part of the 'excite' phase, help us to to generate an interest. Miss Lewtas showed us some beautifully intricate Islamic art patterns. We looked at how

Islamic art is usually made up of geometric shapes and repeated patterns. You will never find images of humans or animals in the Islamic faith because it is believed to be disrespectful. After studying some of the patterns we went onto the playground and created our own designs using coloured chalk. The results were stunning!

As a special treat this week Year 5 also visited West Wirral Works at Hilbre High. The WWW Teachers, Ian and Rob, had prepared a fantastic project for us. We were allowed to design our own Egyptian themed chocolate mould

and wrapper! We My Chocolate Bar Wrapper used CAD aided (computer design) to create our wrappers and the design for our mould. Then Rob took us into a room where he showed how us the moulding process takes place. A laser machine cut out our computer designs



onto pieces of MDF wood. We then assembled these pieces to create a stencil for our mould. Rob then covered our stencils with plastic and put them into a special vacuum machine. When he closed the machine door the air was sucked out of the space between the wood

and plastic. The plastic was then heated until it melted to take the form of the mould, then left to set. The whole process took less than 1 minute! It was a superb day and felt extremely privileged to use the equipment.


