

# Delicious Division with Remainders


Use your times tables to help you find how many times the factor will divide equally into the multiple. Then work out how many will be left over.

Example:  $17 \div 4 =$  \_\_\_\_\_

$$4 \times 4 = 16 \text{ remainder } 1$$

$$17 \div 4 = 4 \text{ r.}1$$
