Gospel Values in our curriculum

Subject: Art

Faithfulness & integrity	Encourage pupils to complete their artwork honestly without copying others' work. Discuss the value of being faithful to their own ideas and putting genuine effort into their creations.
Dignity & Compassion	Explore portraits or artwork that celebrate diverse cultures, abilities, and backgrounds, teaching respect for every person's dignity.
Humility & Gentleness	Teach pupils to appreciate and value their work without boasting, and to give gentle, kind feedback to peers. Collaborative art projects where pupils work quietly and patiently, showing humility in sharing ideas and space.
Truth & Justice	Use art to explore themes of fairness and standing up for what is right. Create posters or murals about fairness, equality, or historical figures who fought for justice.
Forgiveness & Mercy	Encourage pupils to accept mistakes as part of the creative process and to forgive themselves and others for errors. Use "mistake art" techniques where pupils incorporate accidents into their work, teaching that errors can become beautiful parts of the art.
Purity & Holiness	Discuss the idea of purity as clarity or simplicity in art — focusing on clear, honest expression without distractions. Create art inspired by nature or spiritual themes, like using light colours and simple shapes to evoke a sense of peace or sacredness.
Tolerance & Peace	Explore art from different cultures and religions to foster tolerance and understanding.
Service & Sacrifice	Use art to highlight acts of service or sacrifice from history or daily life
